#### We celebrate with bread.

1 Corinthians 11:23-24

"Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, 'Where will you have us prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

άζυμος - pertaining to the absence of yeast, without yeast, not having yeast, unleavened

#### "Jesus took bread..."

"And he took bread..."

Luke 22:19

"...he took bread..."

Mark 14:22

άρτος - a relatively small and generally round loaf of bread
